The Sons of Union Veterans Camp Vienna \#26 was established to preserve the memory of those soldiers who fought and died during the war. This local unit established an army encampment in Tracy Park. As part of the activities, Abby, Kara and David dressed in period costumes for a square dance. In the photo David holds the flag which he accepted for the 56th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. David has been involved with the organization since its inception in 1997. He asked Abby and Kara to join him for this event.

David's body or likeness appears in two places on the mural. In the background, he appears kneeling by an ammunition box. He is depicted as the soldier in the center of the mural.
