
After practice the majority of the class got together for the last time at Pizza Hut.

At six o'clock the sun was shining brightly which was a big relief to all of us.



The moment that we had been waiting for finally arrived. Our diplomas had been presented, the caps had flown. The class of 1993 were now Glenwood High School Alumni.






















