



DEDICATION






Mr. H. W. McKelvey, Principal


Mrs. Eleanor Cookes, Dean of Girls

Mrs. Eleanor Cookes, Dean of Girls, received her B. S. degree from Ohio University, and plans to begin her graduate work in Guidance at the University of Michigan this coming summer.

As Dean of Girls, one of her most important duties is the guidance of girl students in the solving of their problems, both personal and academic. These problems may arise from home difficulties (economic) and physical limitations (health). Parents are encouraged to confer with the Dean and to cooperate with the school in assisting the girls in making their normal adjustments. Very effective work is accomplished each Friday when Mrs. Cookes, accompanied by the school nurse, Miss Mary Wilking, visits the girls who are ill. On these visits parents are consulted in regard to problems affecting the welfare of the girls.

Other duties include the checking of girls' attendance and the appointment of hall monitors who serve as messengers as well as guides to visitors in the building. In addition to her routine tasks Mrs. Cookes is in charge of the school calendar, is sponsor of Senior Honor and Girls' League and acts as chaperon at all school dances and activities.

Dean Cookes' patient understanding of girls' problems and her willingness to help them have been of invaluable assistance to the girls of Portsmouth High School.




Mr. William Snook, Dean of Boys

Mr. William Snook is completing his second year as Dean of Boys at Portsmouth High School. He received his B. S. degree from Wilmington (Ohio) College but had previously attended both Miami and Ohio Universities. His graduate work was done at the University of Cincinnati in Psychology and School Administration. Prior to becoming Dean of Boys, Mr. Snook served twelve years as high school principal and four years as teacher.

His duties include the checking of attendance for boys and the operation of an employment service for male students, both part time and full time. He also assists in all the social activities of the high school and aids in the selection of courses of study. To encourage the development of orderly habits, to reduce failure to a minimum, and to properly advise and understand each boy are some of the objectives of Mr. Snook as Dean of Boys.

Dean Snook's cheerful disposition, sympathetic understanding and splendid cooperation have proved to be of great value to the boys of Portsmouth High School.






Freshman Class


















Jr. Varsity Review

The Frosh evened the count by decisioning Chillicothe at the Stadium 19-0. Singer accounted for two markers with Franz getting the other and a point after.



September 14

After taking the kickoff opening the third period, the Trojans marched steadily down the field sparked by the brilliant broken field running of Dave Thomas. The drive was brought to a climax by Thomas on a beautiful 40 yd. run through the whole St. Mary's team. This loss was the only one suffered by the St. Mary's team this season.

September 21

P. H. S. vs. Charleston Mountain Lions

Portsmouth journeyed to Charleston for the second game of the season and bad, tough luck! The Mountain Lions came from behind in one of the most thrilling games the tri-state area had witnessed in many a year. It was a heart breaker to lose, the margin being in the form of a 93 yd. touchdown run by 133 lb. Charlie Coleman with only a minute remaining in the game. Playing without the services of Co-Captain "Lemon" Elliott, injured, the Portsmouth eleven for 47 minutes outplayed Coach Ed King's charges.

The first Red and Blue store came late in the opening period with Dave Thomas scoring the touchdown. Then, racing the clock, the Mountain Lions countered to make the score 7-6. Midway in the third quarter, Butt recovered a fumble at midfield. Before anyone knew what was happening, Thomas was booming into the end zone from 50 yds. out. J. Thomas kicked the point. A 15 yd. unnecessary roughness penalty put the ball on the 5, and Elliott bucked to the 3 from where Thomas took it over.

October 12

P. H. S. vs. Huntington East Highlanders

After spotting the Highlanders a 13-0 lead in the early minutes, the Red and Blue attack began to click. Huntington looked like champions for about 15 minutes. Then the full fury was rent upon them. November 2 P. H. S. vs. Middletown Middles

Overcoming a 13-0 halftime lead, the powerful Middies rolled back for two quick touchdowns and a tie. Plagued again by heavy going and a constant stream of rain, the Trojans salvaged something. Early in the second quarter Chastain heaved a long pass to Parks for the tally. The final P. H. S. score came when Dave Thomas went over that Elliott converted. In the second half the Middies completely ran away from the Trojan crey, although scoring only in the final period. Incidentally, the Trojans were playing without Pelfrey, Elliett and D. Thomas in the second half. Moving steadily down the field, the enemy pushed over one touchdown and the point. Then, after holding the home team, they marched again. As the rain came down harder, they scored again and missed the conversion by inches.

November 9

P. H. S. vs. Ironton Tigers

In the annual Trojan-Tiger battle, the vaunted unbeaten "tanktowners" had their faces ground into the Beechwood Stadium turf as the Red and Blue warriors came from behind. The final score was anything but the predicted three touchdown Ironton victory. After a hotly contested first half, the Trojans got up steam in the second. Moving against time the Tigers drove 64 yds. with only 40 seconds remaining in the first half. After taking the kickoff opening the third period, the P. H. S. men moved 58 yds. to knot the score at 6-all when Elliott bucked over from the 5.



November 22 P. H. S. vs. Ashland Tomcats



Chemistry Club



Spanish Club


