STUDENTS HOLD ELECTION



CLASS HISTORY

We entered East High School in the fall of 1957 with high hopes and spirits. We began with an enrollment of 140, but only 84 of the more hardy remain. Our freshman year was overshadowed by the doubtful future of East High. Portsmouth was instituting the new 6-3-3 system, and East was to be a junior high. Through the valiant efforts of the Committee for Retention of East High, we were allowed to continue as a four-year high school. As a compromise, the graduation ceremonies of Portsmouth High and East High were combined. Again through the efforts of the Committee, our class will have its own ceremonies at Allard Park.

Our advisors now are Mr. Schomburg, Mr. Donley, Mrs. Basham, and Miss Madeira. Three of our original advisors, who no longer are teaching at East, were Mrs. Edith Stahr, Mrs. Helen Moore, and Mr. Keith Bennett.

Some successful money-raising schemes and some not so successful that the class has been engaged in are candy sales, skating parties, dances, the junior concession stand, magazine sales, the school newspaper, the junior class play, the sale of school supplies, the Tartan-King-and-Queen contest, the sale of graduation announcements and calling cards, and class dues.

Through the cooperation of this class and the class of 1960, a permanent crest was selected for our class rings, and a new three-year contract was signed with the Herff Jones Company. Our class was the first class in the history of East High to contribute to another educational institutional. To bring a day branch of Ohio University to the Portsmouth area, we contributed two dollars per senior.

In our senior year we also set some new sports records. This is the first year that a class has gone through the entire seasons of both football and basketball without a single defeat Morris Gullion, our back, set a new single scoring record in football of 156, thus breaking the former record of 130.


