## WHS Pirates have great year in the SOC

The Pirates laid claim to 11 of 16 SOC championships in the 20062007 school year, including sweeping all five spring sports.

In the fall:
Boys' Cross Country - For a second year in a row, the Pirates claimed the SOC title as well as district title. They scored a perfect 15 at one meet, 1 st through 5 th places, during the season.
Girls' Cross Country - The Lady Pirates won their first SOC championship.
Girls' Tennis - The Lady Pirates had a single loss early against Minford but took the second match 3-2 to share the SOC championship.
Soccer - WHS lost the first game to South Webster and then lost at home to Waverly to give the Tigers a two-game lead. The Pirates pulled off the upset on the Tigers home field to win 2-1 In the final two weeks the Pirates earned the outright championship.

In the winter:
Boys' Basketball - The Pirates turned in another top notch performance, sharing the SOC title with Waverly and making the final four for the second year in a row.
Boys' Swimming - The Pirates reclaimed the SOC title going undefeated during the regular season.

In the spring:
Baseball - The young Pirates went undefeated in the SOC.
Boy's Tennis - The Pirates went undefeated on the season winning their second SOC in a row.
Boys' Track - The Pirates were able to defeat Waveriy by 6.5 points to claim the SOC.
Girls' Track - Without winning a single event, the Lady Pirates edged Waverly 88.5 to 82 for the SOC title.

## Pirates Earn District Runner-up

The Lady Pirates began their season with the annual SOC preview and defeated Clay 21 15, 21-9. In an early SOC II showdown on the court, the Lady Pirates got the first blow in against top rival Minford and downed the Lady Falcons to take a key game. In another classic battle with Northwest, the Lady Pirates came away with a $25-7$, $25-16,26-28,25-8$ win at home to maintain a 4.0 record early in the season. One day before Friday the 13th, the Lady Pirates picked up win \#13 in a big fashion. Ali Conley had 20 kills, 20 digs and 9 blocks to lead the Lady Pirates to a $25-23$, $25-22,35-33$ win against South

Webster. Jessica Blanton had 42 assists in the win that tied the Lady Pirates for second in the SOCII. With a $13-7$ (11.3) record, WHS took on PHS in the first round of the DIV. III sectionals. The Lady Pirates earned the sectional title by defeating West Union 25-15. 25-10, 25-11. Teamwork was the key for WHS in the Div. III district semifinal as they beat Huntington in four games 21 25, 25 13, 25-10, 25-23. The Lady Pirates ended their season as district runner up, sectional champions, SOC Div. II runner up and compiled an overall 18 . 8 (11.3) season record. The JV compiled a 17.2 (13.1) record.

Pirates Earn 3rd Place in SOC

The Pirates relied on a solid mix of seniors and upperclassmen to produce a consistent season on the links in the SOC II. Posting solid scores through their first matches of the season, seniors Alan Gulley, Brandon Cline and Michael Staker took leadership roles for the Pirates. In the second match of the four-match SOC series, WHS placed third with a score of 159 behind South Webster (154) and West (156). Alan Gulley and Tyler Thompson shot 38 and 39 respectively. Batting a tough Dogwood Hills course in the third match of the series, the Pirates headed to the Elks course in third place behind West with 108. WHS finished seven strokes behind South Webster with a 173 and Charles Floyd carded the low
round of the day for the team with a 39. After three SOC matches, the Pirates had earned team scores of 158-159-173 (490). In a wet SOC final match of the series that saw South Webster and West named co champions, WHS finished the round with 173 , only two strokes behind and finished the tournament third, 16 strokes behind the co-champions. In the sectional tournament, the Pirates ended in fifth place by 7 strokes as a team shooting a 340 . Charles Foyd scored an 80, Alan Gulley shot an 83, Brandon Cline carded an 85 , and Andrew Rawlings followed up with a 92 . Charles Floyd was the lone member of the Pirates to qualify individually for the district tournament with a score of 80 in the third spot.

## Pirates Share SOC championship

In regular season, the Lady Pirates suffered only two losses, both early in the season and went on to defeat Notre Dame to share the title as SOC champions. After three hours of play on the first day of the SOC tournament, only WHS, Minford, and Notre Dame remained to advance at least one player to the semifinals with no seeded players losing. Lauren Dever, the Lady Pirates' No. 1 singles, was the No. 1 seed and reached the third round with a bye and a 6-1, 6-0 defeat over her Notre Dame opponent. Gracie Duckworth returned for the second day after a marathon victory against her Minford
opponent that went back and forth for more than two hours before Gracie Duckworth won a tie break to win 6.3, 7.6. ## Pirates win 12th SOC championship

At 9-2 the Pirates put themselves in position to win another SOC Div. II
championship as they defeated Clay 4-0 with only two league games left. On senior night, WHS celebrated the contributions of 12 seniors with a $7-0$ win over Greenup Co . The Pirates won their 12 th SOC championship with an $8-0$ win over the West Senators. Wes Lyon scored four goals in the first half for an individual total of 36 goals to break Bryan Craft's record of 35 from 2004. The Pirates defeated Clay 6.0 to win the sectional championship and to advance to the district
tournament at the Veteran's Memorial Stadium in Chillicothe. The sectional title also gave Head Coach Paul Boll his 300th career victory. The Pirates' season came to an abrupt end with a 1-0 loss to Eastern Brown in the district semitinal game, ending a 12 game winning streak. The Pirate booters achieved the following in the 2000 season: SOC 102 0 , overall 14.30 . SOC champs, sectional champs, scored 74 goals and only allowed 11 goals. Junior Wes Lyon set the WHS single season scoring record at 38 and earned Second Team All. Ohio honors.

## Pirates complete 6-4 record

The Pirates began training with the team's first live-in camp for three days at the field house. The focus was to eat, sleep, breathe, and live football for the Pirates. In their season opener, the Pirates took on the Ironton Tigers in a classic girdiron rivalry. The Tigers prevailed after a field goal in the final two minutes of the game that allowed them to pull ahead for the 24-21 victory. The Pirates got their first win of the season against PHS with a 19.14 score. The following week they beat Boyd Co. for a 2.3 record. WHS kicked off SOC action against a 5.0 Valley team and earned a 21 0 win with a team high
performance of fewest passing yards allowed of only one yard. Against the Waverly Tigers, senior Kailyb Burgess ran for almost twice as many yards as the entire Waverly squad. Pirates Make Final Four for Second Year in a Row

The Pirate tradition continued as they made the Final Four in Div. lll for the second year in a row. it was only the fourth win of the season but it meant a lot more than that as the 61-40 victory against Ironton continued an undefeated season, defeated a Div. Ill rival, and earned win No. 300 for Head Coach Tom Barrick. Consistent with his nature, Coach Barrick turned the focus back onto his players' showing a lot of heart in the win. At the end of January, the Pirates' first loss came at the hands of McClain and then suffered their second defeat in a 57.60 upset by Waverly to force a tie for first place in the SOC II
with the Pirates at $14.2(101)$. The Pirates earned sectional, district, and regional championships as they made their way to the Final Four. knocked down two free throws with 4.1 seconds left to tie the game. However, with a 3 pointer floater at the buzzer by North College Hill, the Trojans went past the Pirates 09.60 in the Div. IIl state semifinal Despite the scoreboard, for WHS and the community the Pirates were winners in all our hearts as they earned a 23.3 season. Cam Miller was named the AP AllOhio Div. III Co-Player of the Year along with Player of the Year in both the SOC and the Southeast District. Drew
Spradlin was named to the All. Ohio Div. III second team. Both have scored over 1,000 career points.

WHS, Notre Dame, Valiey, Northwest and East competed to determine the SOC championship. The Pirates entered the meet undefeated. The Lady Pirates took advantage of their numbers for a solid regular season with only three losses, all to Notre Dame. Eli Gerlach, Spencer Hall, and Bryan Hall led the boys' team while Beth Sloas and Molli Brown anchored the girls' team. Records are made to be broken and the Pirates didn't waste any time doing that in the SOC championship meet as the Pirate boys secured the conference title. As a team, WHS' score of 141 topped the former mark of

97 the team set in 2005 . The Pirates finished 1 st in all but two events-the 500 freestyle and the $50-\mathrm{m}$ freestyle. Behind the top two single players in the SOC, the Pirates went undefeated on the season winning their second SOC in a row. In the SOC match, neither Adams or Pierron had lost a set in the toumament and forced a rematch of last year's finals. Adams won the first set 0.4 but Pierron rallied to win the next two 6-1, 6-3. Doubles Trevor Miller and Alex Provaznik lost in the semifinal round $6-2,6-4$. Twenty eight players competed in the SOC II singles toumament but only senior Tyler Adams earned the right to play at the state level by defeating the Bishop Ready opponent at districts. Up 6.4 in
a second-set tiebreaker to his opponent, Tyler scored the next point to put the finishing touches on a $6.2,7.6$ (7.4) win to qualify for his first state tournament. No. I singles Chad Pierron lost to the Columbus Academy player who finished third in the state in 2006. Chad, who went to state as a sophomore, continued to help his teammate to prepare. Tyler's four years of Pirate tennis came to an end with a $0.3,7-5$ loss against a No. 1 seed in the first round of the state tournament at OSU. He will continue his tennis career at Baldwin-Wallace College and carry a piece of Pirate pride with him.

After losing a strong senior class from last year, the young Pirates with only one senior went undefeated in the SOC losing only to non-conference Greenup Co. in the first game of the season and to Ironton in a late season game. Scoring runs was a Pirate consistency throughout the season that included numerous home runs and grand slams. In the Div. III sectional tournament, WHS (20-2) pounded River Valley $27-3$ in the first game and defeated Ironton 4.2 for the sectional championship title. The game was a pitchers duel with Jordan Russell on the mound for the

Pirates as only one run scored on something other than a homer. Aaron Hopper got a two run homer in the third inning and a solo shot from Adam Wamsley in the fifth. Pirate Jordan Russell had pitched seven innings of shutout baseball and the defense had played well as the game was a scoreless tie. The Pirates managed to get two runners on base in the bottom of the seventh but would not score. The Pirates lost 0-1 to Zane Trace for the district championship title. The Pirates' season ended with a record of 24-3, an undefeated SOC season and SOC II championship, district runner-up, and ranked \#6 in the state.
