off the wheat ground

with two sleds  
until noon.  
Dug palatoc  
the rest of the  
day.  
Gene is still  
here.

Sat. Oct. 9

A nice day day

hauled until

a hundred sheets  
by noon.  
The then finished  
digging the patch  
of palatoc  
located then  
and buried  
them. It got  
dark by 5:30  
on the whole. Kate

and was ready  
to come here by  
10. Arrived here  
by 3 P.M.  
Got some grain  
but the mill

brush and olives  
with Bill & Hain

Carl at night

was drunk all

and harvested

and I drilled
