
Dedication

Class History

It all began September 9, 1967. We 68 freshmen were ready to begin our high school careers. To lead the class, we chose Phyllis Slone. President; Patty Grant. Vice President; Barb Reinhardt, Secretary; Vickie Holsinger. Treasurer; and Bill Newberry, Reporter. We chose as our Homecoming Attendant the lovely Debbie Justice. We were under the supervision of Mr. Bond, Mr. Rowland, and Mr. Simpson.

Decreasing in size, we 58 sophomores entered school on September 3, 1968. Playing the leading roles were Diana Day. President; Bev Sparks, Vice President; Barb Reinhardt, Secretary; Vickie Holsinger, Treasurer; and Rusty Milliron, Reporter. Maria Pellegrinon was chosen as our Homecoming Attendant. Our sponsors remained the same.

Entering the junior class were 53 fun-loving students on September 2, 1969. We chose to represent us Pam Thompson. President; Debbie Justice. Vice President; Bev Sparks. Secretary; Vickie Holsinger, Treasurer; and Dave Fitch. Reporter. Our Homecoming Attendant was the pretty Lily McKenzie. In November our class rings arrived and we strolled the halls with the biggest heads ever, for we were the most envied by the lower classmen. For Christmas, Bill Newberry was chosen as Yule King and Jane Clevenger was runner-up for Yule Queen. One of the highlights of our junior year was the class play, "Get Witch Quick," directed by Miss Karen Triggs. and presented on March 13, 1970. It was a great success. We chose as our Yearbook King and Queen Candidates the perfect pair, Dave Fitch and Jerri Fraley. We honored the senior class with a great prom entitled "Shower of Stars" held on May 22, 1970, at the Elks' City Club. We were now under the management of Mr. Bond and Mr. Groh.

We had an unfortunate summer after the death of one of our dear classmates, Rick Eldridge. We never dreamed it could happen to one of us.

After the tragedy we 53 seniors made our final performance through the halls of Glenwood High School. To take us through this final year, we chose Debbie Justice, President; Pam Thompson, Vice President; Barb Reinhardt, Secretary; Vickie Holsinger. Treasurer; and Jane Clevenger, Reporter. We were still advised by Mr. Bond and Mr. Groh. Vickie Holsinger reigned as Homecoming Queen and Debbie Justice was featured as Senior Attendant. Our class play, "Room For One More," was also a great success. It was presented on December 10, 1970, and was directed by Mrs. Cleo P. Rittenhouse. Our Christmas King and Queen were Dave Fitch and Jerri Fraley. Chosen as Yearbook King and Queen were none other than Mutt and Jeff, alias Bob Horsley and Gail Baker. On April 22, 24 loaded seniors, rather 24 seniors loaded the bus that was bound for Washington. D. C. and Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. We were very thankful to have Mr. Cullum and Mr. Groh accompany us. On May 14, 1971, we were honored by the juniors with a great Prom entitled "Moonlight and Roses." It was held at the American Legion Hall. Our Baccalaureate was held on May 23, 1971, and Commencement on May 26, 1971. Kathy Pottenger holds the honor as Valedictorian and Marilyn Sutton as Salutatorian. And now, what was once a dream has become a reality. We are leaving the halls of Glenwood High School. But maybe it is a good thing because Mr. Pellegrinon and Mr. Cullum couldn't stand to lose any more hair!

Class Prophecy

I was awakened this morning by a phone call informing me that I had won a tour of the world. I left at once for Cincinnati, where I planned to spend the day with Pam Thompson, official scorekeeper of the Reds. The only transportation was the New Boston Cab Co., operated by Wanda Potts, who had taken over Dewey's business.
