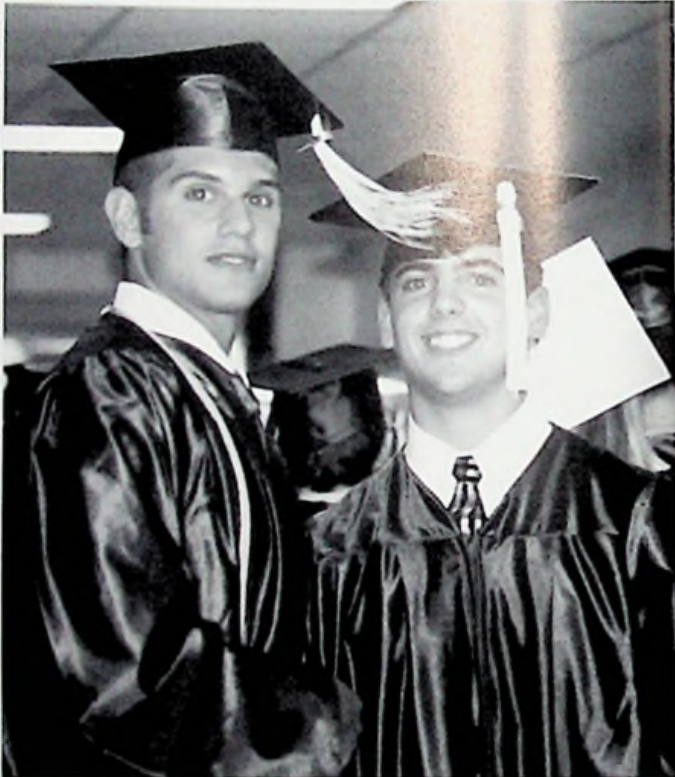
The day you think will never come is finally here. It almost doesn't seem real. You think of the times that you wished it was over and now you suddenly realize it's gone.

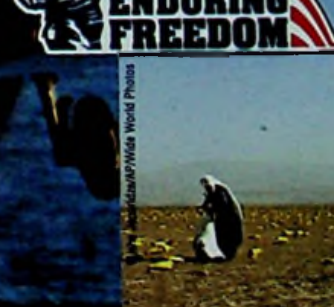

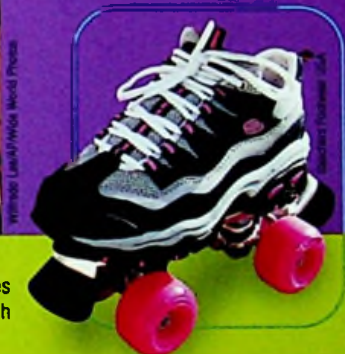

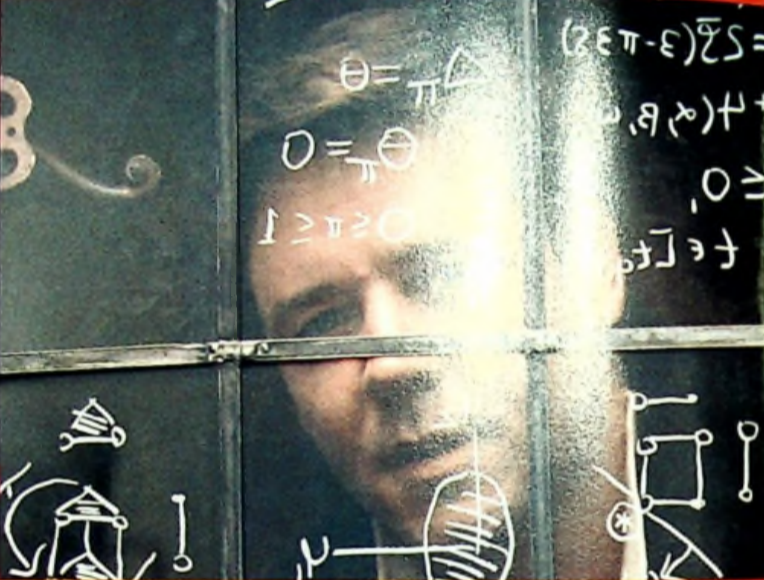

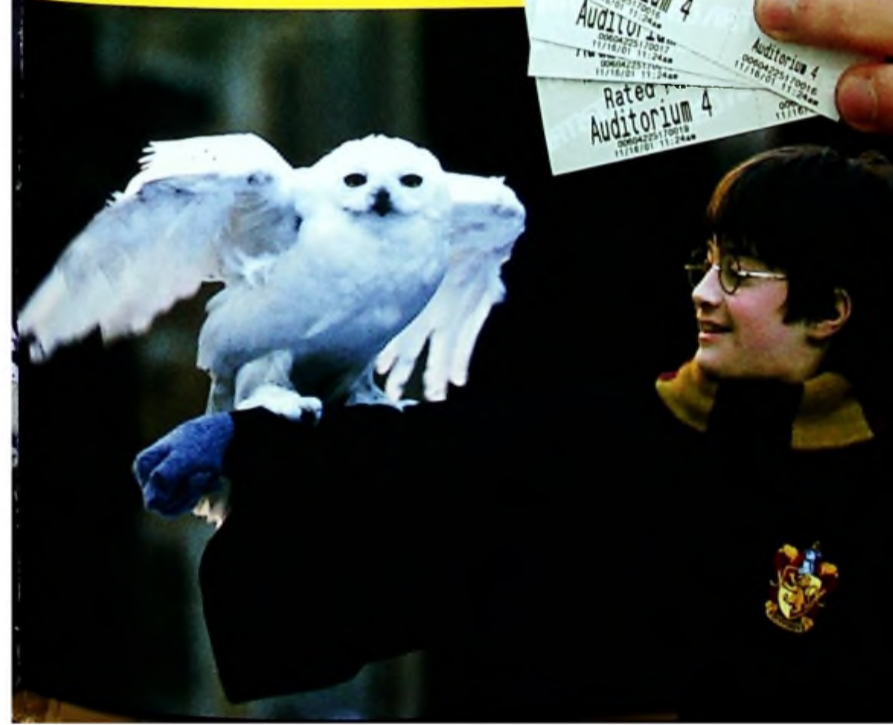

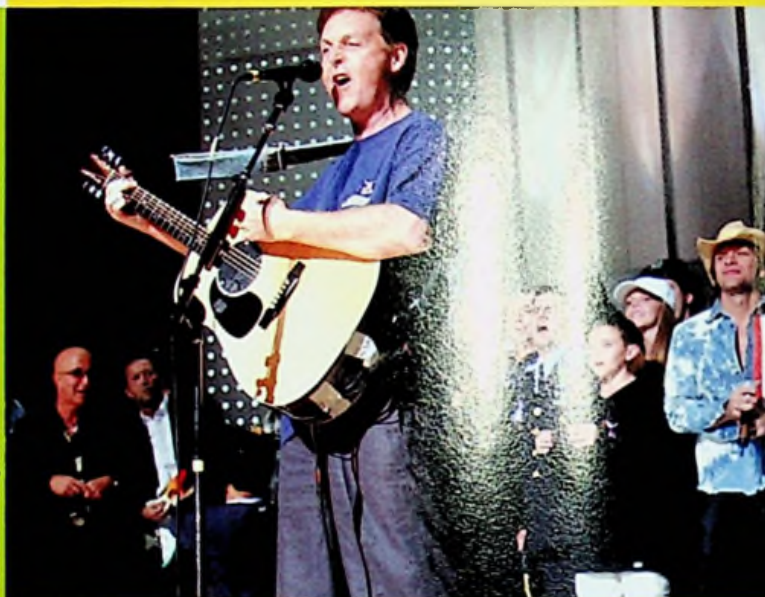

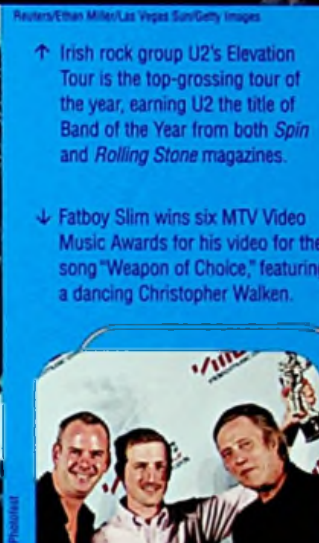

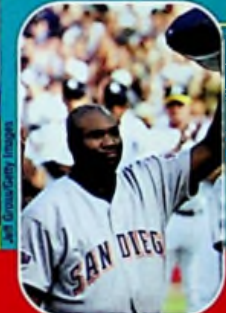
