# Superintendent's Message 

## RAYMOND E HALL

To the members of the class of 1967, I extend my most cordial congratulations for the honors you have bestowed upon your school and the completion of a planned public education program.

Your school hopes that you have achieved one of the great and controlling aims of public education - developing student responsibility and encouraging independent learning. In developing your capacity for independent learning the school has helped you to help yourselves. The school has given you experiences, understanding, skills, and interests that will serve you for the rest of your lives. I am sure that all of us at Glenwood have learned more since we left school than we leamed in all of our years of formal education. ## Principal's Message

Concepts of a Comprehensive High School:

1. Offering of a minimum of forty-five units of credit.
2. Pupil-teacher ratio of not more than twenty-five to one.
3. Language Laboratory for both English and Language.
4. Reading Laboratory to encourage good readers to become better readers and to assist slow readers to improve.
5. Complete intercommunication system.
6. Basic subject offering should include: English, Mathematics, Business Education, Social Studies, Language, Art, Science, Industrial Arts, Home Economics, and Vocal Music.
7. Special education classes should include: Remedial Reading, Progressive Reading and slow learning classes.
8. In order to meet the needs of pupils not going on to college we need a further diversified educational program consisting of Vocational Education and a Technical Education program. (Such specialized education would be most effective and efficient on a county wide cooperative program.)
9. Library facilities to serve not only the school but the community as well.
10. Adequate material facilities for each classroom, laboratory, library, storage etc.

## Class History

On September 3, 1963 seventy-three lively freshmen began roaming through the halls of Glenwood. To begin our first year of high school, we chose as our class officers Lana Williams, President; Jim Pellegrinon, Vice President; Patti Jones, Secretary; Brenda Jennings, Treasurer; and Bill Jenkins, Reporter. Debbie Huffman was chosen as our Homecoming Attendant, while Peggy Collier and John Foit represented us as Annual Queen and King candidates. We were guided through our first year by Mrs. Clerico, Miss Curry, and Mr. Groh.

With one successful year behind us, we sixty-six sophomores began to complete the task of another school year. Our officers for the year were: Mike Fitch, President; Jim Pelligrinon, Vice President; Lana Williams, Secretary; Bill Jenkins, Treasurer; and Pat Figgins, Reporter. Lana Williams was elected Homecoming Attendant. Our Annual King and Queen candidates were Cathy Riffe and John Foit. We were very fortunate to have Mr. Ralph O. Darling and Mr. Donald Cullum as class advisors throughout the rest of our school days. At the close of the year we excitedly ordered our class rings.

After summer vacation, we returned in the fall of 1965 to begin our junior studies. Realizing the importance of the year, we thoughtfully elected as our President, Jim Pellegrinon; Vice President, John Foit; Secretary, Cathy Riffe; Treasurer, Brenda Jennings; and Reporter, Mike Skiver. After receiving our much-desired class rings, we presented on November 19, 1965 our Junior Class Play. "Stranger In the Night", which was directed by Mrs. Campbell. In May we had the privilege of honoring the graduating class at the JuniorSenior Prom with the theme of "Stardust". We chose as our Junior Attendant Sue Thacker. Connie Gulley and Dana Mauk were Annual King and Queen candidates while Peggy Collier represented us in the River Days Festival.

The summer which passed very quickly soon brought us back to Glenwood to complete our final year. We chose as our class officers Cathy Riffe, President; Jim Pellegrinon, Vice President; Patti Jones, Secretary; John Foit, Treasurer; and Connie Gulley, Reporter. The student body elected Patti Jones to reign as Homecoming Queen with Lana Williams as her Senior Attendant. Donna Day and Dana Mauk were chosen as Annual King and Queen for the year of 1967. After weeks of hard work the Seniors presented on April 14, 1967, their class play "Brother Goose" directed by Mrs. Wellman. On April 25, thirty-five seniors and three chaperons boarded the bus for Washington, D. C. to spend a few days of fun-filled adventures that we will never forget. We saw many memorable sights: the Capitol, the Smithsonian Institute, President Kennedy's grave and the Washington Monument. In Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, we visited the Wax Museum and toured the battlefields of the Civil War. We returned home weary of travel but anxious to finish the school year. The final dance of the year was the Junior-Senior Prom given in honor of the senior class. The theme was "Moonlight and Roses" and the music was provided by "Your Lovin Saint Bernard".

Only a short time ago, we were freshmen looking upon the next four years with great apprehension; now we, as young men and women, are about to walk through the threshold of life after our graduation on May 31, 1967.
